MINUTES – FINAL

I. Review of School Narrative and Data

Mrs. Jewkes presented the Peruvian Park neighborhood and SALTA students school narratives. The narratives summarized the schools progress in relation to RCBM and MCOMP benchmarks. They also summarize improvement and acceleration strategies.

II. Review of Continuous School Improvement Plan (CSIP)

Mrs. Jewkes reviewed the CSIP and its relationship with the School LAND Trust plan. She outlined the process, actions, and timelines and specifically outlined the responsibilities of SCC members, BLT members, and the administrator.

Emily Anderegg asked that a copy of the Professional Development Plan be made available to the council members. This is currently developed on a school, rather than a district level. The current plan makes provision for PP teachers to workshop with and observe each other. Wednesday meetings are held monthly in order to train on curriculum. Funding is used for substitutes during these meetings. Emily Anderegg also asked if there is a way to measure progress here.

III. Review and Approval of School LAND Trust Plan

The School LAND Trust plan was revised and approved by the council. All 6 members attending approved the plan. 3 absent members participated and approved the plan prior to meeting. 1 absent member did not participate.

IV. Review of the STEM and PBIS sections of the CSIP

Following review of the School LAND Trust Plan, Mrs. Jewkes reviewed the STEM (academic) and PBIS (behavioral) components of the CSIP. Parents in the council suggested that part of the recognition system for positive behaviors include contact with parents.

V. Other Items

PTA President, Stacy Kratz, reported that the school fundraiser was very successful. In addition to adequate funds raised, there has been positive feedback from parents, students, and PTA leaders due to changes in how the money is raised.

Mrs. Jewkes will provide a copy of the Professional Development Plan to the council.
PTA President, Stacy Kratz volunteered to schedule the school carnival.
