I. Welcome/Call to Order/Public Comment

No public comment.

II. Approve Minutes

Motion to approve: Stacey Kratz. Second: Jen Crane. Vote: Unanimous

III. Review Mid-Winter Testing Data

The mid-winter reading (RCBM) testing data shows that all neighborhood classrooms have shown remarkable improvement since last winter. 72% of neighborhood students are meeting or exceeding benchmark standards, up from 59% last winter.

The mid-winter math (MCOMP) testing data shows that all neighborhood classrooms have shown remarkable improvement since last winter. 84% of neighborhood students are meeting or exceeding benchmark standards, up from 62% last winter.

Most SALTA Students are approximating or reaching a score of 90% correct on CFA's (multi-topic unit testing) for both reading and math. All students are exceeding 80% correct on CFA's. Principal Jewkes reports that the district SALTA team is evaluating ways to measure progress of SALTA students over time.

IV. Midyear Summary of Expenditures and Progress Report

A. *Total Fund Distribution: \$40,222*

B. *Expenses to Date: \$ 15,192.37*

1. *Intervention Employees Wages and Benefits: \$14,987.37*

2. *Substitutes: \$205.00*

C. *Remaining Balance: \$ 25,029.63*

Remaining funds will be used to pay wages and benefits for intervention employees, provide substitutes for in-school and out-of-school professional development, and supplies, such as timers.

V. 2015-1016 LAND Trust Plan

The initial outline for this plan includes the following items:

1. Keeping the current reading goals, funds, and measures in place as they are working with measurable success.
2. Eliminating the technology component of the plan in order to direct remaining funds toward math intervention. Keep the current math goals and measures in place.
3. Making specific provisions for supplies needed to carry out reading and math intervention.
4. Making specific provisions for substitutes needed to coordinate reading and math intervention and coaching.
5. Making specific provisions for substitutes to enable the Building Leadership Team (BLT) to develop and evaluate the Continuous School Improvement Plan (CSIP) as well as facilitate professional development.
6. Principal Jewkes stated that next year's funds will be closer to our original \$32,000. We will be prepared to finalize and vote on the LAND Trust Plan at the March 26th meeting. All members of the School Community Council must attend and/or participate.

VI. Review Professional Development and Reading Achievement Plans

These plans should be available after the district school board meeting in March and the Building Leadership Team (BLT) meetings needed to develop the Continuous School Improvement Plan (CSIP). The Professional Development Plan is incorporated into the CSIP.

VII. Survey Results – Next Survey

31 parents responded to our survey.

Question 1: Do you know your child's current academic goals? 31 Yes. 0 No.

Question 2: Do you know Peruvian Park's 2014-1015 academic goals? 11 Yes. 20 No.

Question 3: Are you receiving regular communications from your child's teacher? 30 Yes. 1 No.

We discussed briefly areas where the school goals are visible. These include the LAND Trust site, the sign posted on the front board near the school entry, and the PP SCC web page. No additional survey planned at this time.

VIII. Close/Next Meeting/Looking Forward

March Timeline: Finalize and Vote on School Improvement Plan and review any other plans (Professional Development, Reading Achievement) as needed for submission,
